The Bridging of the Bay event officially announces the coupling of two notable bay area organizations to form


Goodwill of the San Francisco Bay, now serving Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo and Solano counties and expanding Goodwill's mission of workforce development, training and career services for people facing barriers to employment. The event will also celebrate all of the individuals who, with the help of programs at Goodwill San Francisco Bay, have and continue to transform their lives through training and the power of work.

In the spirit of this merger, guests have been asked to consider a donation of gently used items to support employment opportunities and support their local Goodwill.

About Goodwill SF Bay

Goodwill San Francisco Bay is a 100% local and 100% nonprofit organization whose mission is to prepare and guide individuals with barriers to employment towards a path to financial stability through meaningful job opportunities. As a nonprofit social enterprise, Goodwill SF Bay is able to provide paid employment with benefits, free personalized career services, and professional skills development through the revenue gained by donations and resale at online and retail stores. Donations at one of Goodwill SF Bay's 33 donation sites have also aided in diverting millions of pounds of waste from local landfills each year, most of which are transported to retail locations by a fleet of e-trucks that have reduced over 400 tons of greenhouse gas emissions over the last three years. A commitment to sustainability and giving individuals a second chance through the power of work remains the foundation of Goodwill SF Bay's goals for all six Bay Area counties they serve.

William Rogers has served as the President and CEO of SF Goodwill since 2016 and is now the Chair of the California Council of Goodwills. Before joining Goodwill, William spent seventeen years working in the public sector, including serving as the Deputy City Manager for the City of Berkeley. Since then, William has been named one of the “Talented Black Twenty-Five” leaders in Northern California by the Sun Reporter, and in 2020, the San Francisco Business Times recognized him as one of the top 12 San Francisco LGBTQ+ business leaders in the Bay Area.
